




#### What is anti-racism?

"The term "anti-racism" was popularized by Ibram X. Kendi in his memoir, "How to be an Anti-racist"

Kendi articulates that the underlying tenet of anti-racism is the belief that all races and ethnic groups are equal and deserving of the same opportunities. But the most important part of anti-racism is the next step, which is to do something about the existing inequality.





"Anti-racism is an active and conscious effort to work against multidimensional aspects of racism," Robert J. Patterson professor of African-American studies

Double consciousness is the internal conflict experienced by subordinated or colonized groups in an oppressive society. W. E. B. Du Bois, The Souls of Black Folk







History often depicts the captured Africans as meekly succumbing to slavery and their fate that awaited them in North America This bias depiction is not true as the institution of slavery was resisted by the enslaved Africans in many ways.

Many African Kings and Queens spoke out against the slave trade such as: . In the early 17th century, Nzinga Mbandi, queen of

Ndongo (Angola) waged a century long campaign against the Portuguese and their enslavement of Africans.

. Kongo ruler Nzinga Mbemba (Afonso I) wrote to the King of Portugal demanding the end of the illegal depopulation of his jkingdom.

· Several major states took measures to limit and suppress the slave trade, banning it and also attacked European forts.

Seven major rebellions in Jamaica from 1673 and 1686 and several others during the same time period in Antigua, Nevis and the Virgin Islands During the Amina rebellion on St. John in the Danish Virgin Islands, Africans took control of the island for six months

before being defeated. Toussaint L'Ouverture led 500,000 enslaved Africans and free people in Dominque to defeat the armies of France, Spain and Britain in 1804.

Inspired by this event, a revolt occurred in 1816 with the Bussa rebellion in Barbados.

African-American abolitionist and political activist Harriet Tubman liberated more than 700 enslaved people in the United States.

Between the 17th and 19th centuries, enslaved Africans and African Americans in British North America and the United States staged hundreds of revolts most notable were the Nat. Turner and 1811 slave renbellions

The role of the First Lady is to attend many official ceremonies and functions of state either along with, or in place of the President.



He became the first black president of South Africa in 1994, serving until 1999. In 2009, Mandela's birthday (July 18) was declared "Mandela Day" to promote plobal peace and celebrate the South African leader's legacy Mandala died at his home on December 5, 2013, at age 95.
