Engagement survey

- 600 residents completed an online survey
 - 36% reported a total family income before tax of \$40,000 or less
 - 11% reported their primary source of income as Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Program





What we heard

"When a crisis hits, everything is gone in a minute. And it's devastating to lose everything" "I'm a senior in a modest home alone and have to choose between food and utilities... I'm just trying to keep my head above inflation"

"I used to live a good life, and now I don't feel like a human...When you're down, everyone wants to kick you. I now know what that saying means, it's a never-ending cycle."

"People look at you like you are worthless"





Indigenous engagement


- 200+ Indigenous people provided input via survey and at Indigenous events



Indigenous Well-being

Indigenous community to develop a strategy for Indigenous specific poverty reduction initiatives.



Food Security

Improve access to fresh, culturally appropriate, affordable and nutritious foods through income-based solutions to food insecurity.



Housing

Provide housing stability services for people living in poverty to maintain current housing, prevent eviction, improve social inclusion and access income through periods of financial instability.



Income

Increase opportunities for living wage employment in Niagara and advocate for adequate, livable rates from government income assistance programs.



Early Child Development

Improve access to affordable, high-quality child care for families living in poverty or at risk of poverty.



Employment

Promote and develop decent work opportunities that provide fair wages, and benefits and fosters stable, consistent and safe employment.



Mental Health and Addiction

Enhance core service capacity and offer a choice of timely, early recovery interventions and treatments for people who are living in poverty or at risk of poverty.



Transportation

Continue the work of Niagara Region Transit to achieve affordable and equitable access to services across municipalities.

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Components in Motion

Internal

- Apply the strategy to amplify Regional efforts
- Align with Niagara Prosperity Initiative grant program

External

- Support Niagara Poverty Reduction Network
- Explore how interested and affected parties contribute



Momentum through promotion

- Niagara Region staff made presentations about the strategy reaching over 200 people from 20 community groups or agencies
- 191 Community Champions added to an email distribution list to receive the strategy and updates
- Ongoing meetings of Niagara Region staff across departments held to determine ways to advance the strategy and track aligned actions in Enviso





Measuring what matters





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Evaluation plan

- Tell the story of change in Niagara
- Build confidence of decision makers such as Niagara Region Council in how the strategy is being implemented
- Increase understanding of Indigenous prosperity
- Learn how to improve the strategy and funded projects





Evaluation questions

- How well has the strategy met its goals?
- How well were funded projects put into practice?
- •What impact did funded projects have?
- •What can improve implementation?
- •What hindered success?





Sample indicators

- Number of champions involved in the strategy by sector
- Status of actions named in the strategy
- Number of people who complete ODSP applications leading to increased income
- Amount of money recovered through tax-filing
- Number of domestic violence survivors and children who retain permanent housing away from their abusers
- Number of Indigenous youth who report positive progress with employment and mental health





Where it has brought us





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Transit Benefit Pass

- Approved by Niagara Transit
 Commission Board in March
 2025
- Offers a \$50 monthly pass to Ontario Works and Ontario Disability Support Program recipients and low-income individuals



Call to increase social assistance rates

- Report to Niagara Region Council with delegation from Niagara Poverty Reduction Network
- •Council sent correspondence to the Province requesting an increase in OW and ODSP rates and indexing OW like ODSP.





Niagara Prosperity Initiative 2025-27

Seven agencies funded to address six areas of investment identified through the strategy.


